Executive Summary

Boise State University seeks a strategic, forward-looking academic leader to serve as its next Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs. Reporting directly to the President, the Provost serves as the university's Chief Academic Officer and plays a central role in shaping and advancing Boise State's academic, research, and student success priorities.

As Idaho's largest public university, Boise State serves more than 28,500 students and offers a broad portfolio of undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs. Over the past several years, the institution has experienced record enrollment growth, significant increases in student retention and graduation rates, and substantial expansion in research productivity and doctoral education. A metropolitan research university deeply connected to the economic and workforce needs of Idaho, Boise State has emerged as a national model for integrating student success, innovation, community engagement, and applied research, while positioning itself for Carnegie R1 research university classification.

At a time of significant change across higher education and within the university, Boise State seeks a provost who can build trust, foster collaboration, and strengthen relationships across the university community. The successful candidate will demonstrate a commitment to transparent communication, shared governance, and thoughtful leadership that balances innovation with institutional stability.

Boise State has experienced significant growth in research activity, doctoral education, enrollment, and national visibility, establishing itself as one of the nation's rising public universities. The next Provost will help shape the institution's next chapter, building on this momentum to advance student success, expand scholarly impact, strengthen academic quality, and foster innovation across the university.

Working closely with the President, deans, faculty, and university leadership, the Provost will guide the continued evolution of Boise State as a premier student-success driven, public research university. This includes advancing innovation in teaching and learning; strengthening alignment among academic programs, workforce needs, research and creative activity, and community impact; stewarding resources in support of academic priorities and long-term sustainability; and articulating the value of a Boise State education for students, families, and the state of Idaho.

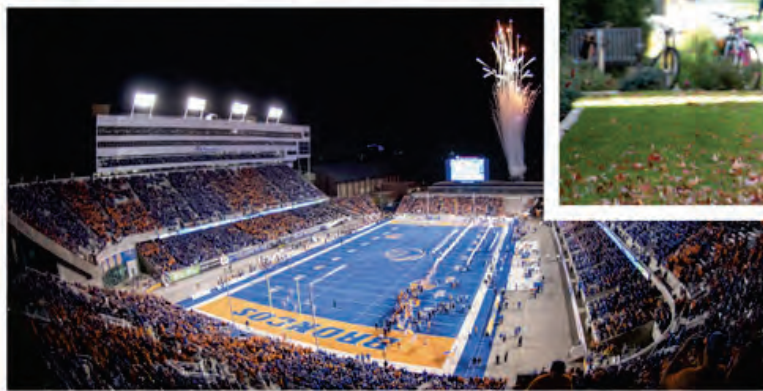

Boise State is on the threshold of Carnegie R1 classification, reflecting years of growth in research activity, doctoral education, and scholarly impact. The next Provost will help guide the university through this milestone and ensure that continued research growth remains aligned with Boise State's longstanding commitment to student success and academic excellence. Working closely with academic and research leaders, the Provost will position the university to leverage the opportunities associated with R1 status while further strengthening its national reputation.



Supporting a Thriving Academic Community

The Provost will champion an academic culture that attracts, develops, and retains outstanding faculty, staff, and academic leaders. Through visible, engaged leadership, the successful candidate will support professional growth and strengthen a culture of excellence. The role also presents an opportunity to articulate a compelling vision for the arts, humanities, social sciences, professional disciplines, and STEM fields alike, ensuring that all colleges and programs see their contributions reflected in Boise State's academic mission and future direction.

Aligning Academic Programs with Workforce, Student, and Community Needs

As Idaho's metropolitan research university, Boise State plays a critical role in workforce development, economic advancement, and civic engagement throughout the region and state. The Provost will work with deans, faculty, and external partners to ensure academic offerings remain responsive to emerging opportunities and student needs. Particular opportunities exist to strengthen experiential learning, career-connected education, interdisciplinary programs, and the value proposition of a Boise State education for students and families, including first-generation students and those navigating financial challenges.

Advancing Innovation and Academic Transformation

Innovation is central to Boise State's identity and strategic vision. The Provost will build upon this culture by supporting new approaches to teaching, learning, and academic delivery that meet the needs of today's learners. In partnership with faculty and academic leaders, the Provost will help the institution approach artificial intelligence, online education, lifelong learning, and emerging modes of instruction as integrated, university-wide strategies.

Building Trust and Organizational Alignment

Boise State's culture is grounded in collaboration, shared governance, and a strong commitment to institutional success. The Provost will partner closely with faculty, academic leaders, staff, and executive colleagues to support transparent communication, strengthen shared decision-making, and guide units through recent and ongoing organizational change. The successful candidate will be a visible, relationship-oriented leader whose values, priorities, and decision-making principles are clear and consistently understood across the university.

Managing a Transparent Budgeting Process

As Boise State continues to evolve its budget model and resource allocation practices, the Provost will help ensure that financial decisions support academic priorities, institutional mission, and long-term sustainability. The successful candidate will engage academic leaders meaningfully in resource discussions, bring clarity to complex budget dynamics, and help prevent resource models from creating unintended competition among colleges. By balancing thoughtful centralization with appropriate college-level autonomy, the Provost will help academic units remain focused on student success, academic quality, research growth, and community impact.

Strengthening Partnerships and Community Impact

Boise State's success is closely connected to the vitality of the Treasure Valley and to strong relationships with business, industry, government, and community partners. As a visible ambassador for the institution, the Provost will help deepen external partnerships, strengthen Boise State's impact throughout Idaho, and enhance its growing influence on a national stage. This work will require pragmatic, mission-centered leadership that can communicate the value of public higher education in Idaho and advance Boise State's priorities with clarity and credibility.

OUR HISTORY

Boise State has marked many history-making moments since its beginnings as a junior college in 1932 to recent accomplishments as Idaho's largest university.

Bronco Milestones



1932: Bishop Middleton Barnwell of the Episcopal Church oversaw the founding of Boise Junior College.

1934: The school became an independent junior college after the Episcopal Church ended its affiliation.

1940: The campus moved to its current location on the south bank of the Boise River.

1965: Boise Junior College gained four-year status as Boise College and began awarding baccalaureate degrees.

1969: The school joined the Idaho state system of higher education and got a new name: Boise State College.

1974: Boise State became a university, the third state university in Idaho. Buster Bronco, Boise State's beloved mascot, also debuted in 1974.

1986: Boise State changed its green field to blue.

1989: Boise State celebrated the largest enrollment in the state.

1992: The State Board of Education approved Boise State's first doctoral program in curriculum and instruction. The university now offers 15 doctoral programs, including educational technology, computer and materials science and biomedical engineering.

2007: The Broncos pulled off one of the greatest upsets in college football history by beating the University of Oklahoma in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl. This victory put Boise State University on the national stage and sparked rapid enrollment growth. Boise State surpassed 25,000 students in the next decade.

2012: Boise State opened the Micron College of Business and Economics Building in 2012. It was the first of several major campus expansion projects completed in partnership with Micron.

FACULTY HAVE AN ACTIVE PARTNERSHIP WITH A COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION

In 2006, Boise State was one of only 76 universities in the nation initially selected by the Carnegie Foundation as a Community Engaged Institution.

That classification was renewed in 2015 in recognition of the myriad ways that Boise State actively works to align with the cares, interests and activities of our local and state community.

This commitment to service continues to be a defining feature of the university. Boise State successfully renewed its classification as a Carnegie Community Engaged Institution, covering the period from 2024 to 2032.



Our university is leveraging existing partnerships and programs and developing new opportunities with Idaho employers and private partnerships. Together we are addressing workforce, research, educational and service needs.

Expanding partnerships across Idaho helps ensure rural communities have access to high-quality educational programming that fits their needs. Boise State recently created two new positions — a Director for University Industry collaborations and the President's Professor of Public Scholarship and Engagement — focused on growing partnerships, both in number and depth.

Idaho has one of the fastest-growing economies in the nation and higher education institutions in Idaho contribute **\$4.5 billion to the state's economy**. Industry has called on Boise State to play a key role in American competitiveness in energy and semiconductors. The university has invested in these strategic and critical growth areas. Boise State is the only university in Idaho to become a member of the national Council on Competitiveness.

The Institute for Advancing American Values represents **Boise State's commitment to civil discourse, free speech and Idaho voices**. Through a series of events held on campus and around the state, a wide range of perspectives have been presented to numerous audiences, who agree, simply, to listen.



COLLEGES

Boise State offers a high-quality undergraduate education as well as a supportive Graduate College that cultivates the personal and career growth of students. Boise State continues to expand its curricular offerings in targeted areas driven by student, industry and community demand.



COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

The College of Arts and Sciences features the largest set of academic subjects of any college at Boise State. The newest program offerings are in neuroscience, professional and public writing and music production. This college is home to the School of the Arts and the School of the Environment.

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

Boise State has more business degree options than any other school in Idaho and most schools in the Pacific Northwest. It is ranked in the top 3% of business schools globally based on its AACSB accreditation. Newest program offerings are in business analytics, cybersecurity management and information systems and control.





COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND PUBLIC SERVICE

In March of 2026, the University combined the College of Education and the School of Public Service to create the College of Education and Public Service. Education programs serve future and current educators within a dynamic community that helps them continually advance their skills. Newest program offerings are in generative AI in education and outdoor education and leadership.

Public Service programs focus on experiential learning that prepares students for successful careers in the public sector. Newest degree offerings are in public service leadership, legal studies and environmental management.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

Idaho's largest engineering school is home to nine academic departments, each dedicated to excellence in education, research, and innovation. Newest program offerings are in cyber operations and resilience, semiconductors, and Ph.D.s in engineering and biomedical engineering.



COLLEGE OF HEALTH SCIENCES

College of Health Sciences graduates become the nurses, doctors, respiratory therapists, radiologic technologists and other health professionals whom Idaho needs. Newest program offerings are in neuroscience, physical activity and sport, exercise and health data analytics.



HONORS COLLEGE

With 109 nationally competitive award winners in the past 10 years, Boise State set an Idaho record in 2020 with five Fulbright Scholarship recipients and two Truman Scholars. In 2023-24, the university celebrated four Fulbright recipients, two Goldwater Scholars and a Critical Language Scholar. Boise State has three Rhodes Scholars.

GRADUATE COLLEGE

Idaho's largest graduate school and its active research faculty have advanced students and the state by fostering discovery and innovation. The newest offerings are in generative AI in education, digital communications management and family nurse practitioner emphasis in the doctorate of nursing practice.

Boise State has greatly expanded educational access across Idaho and beyond with online classes and degree programs. Because they can be accessed any time, they create opportunities for busy working adults and others who are unable to travel to campus. Over the past decade, we have made strategic investments in infrastructure and staffing to create programs across colleges.



ALBERTSONS LIBRARY

Albertsons Library advances teaching, learning and research across Boise State by connecting the university community with information, expertise and technology. The library provides research support and instruction, access to extensive physical and digital collections, and spaces and technologies that support collaboration, discovery and innovation.



ATHLETICS

Boise State builds champions on and off the field. Our student athletes achieved a 3.42 cumulative GPA, the highest in athletics history and accomplished an all-time high graduation rate of 94%.

IDAHO



From the jagged peaks at its center to the rolling hills and lakes of the panhandle and the rich farmland of the Snake River Plain, Idaho is a land of striking contrasts. Mt. Borah rises to a dramatic 12,662 feet, while the Port of Lewiston — at just 738 feet above sea level — is the most inland seaport on the West Coast. Idaho is home to sand dunes, lava fields and the aromatic sagebrush steppe. Eastern Idaho is a gateway to Yellowstone Teton Territory, which includes some of the most stunning landscapes in the world.

Each year, more than 20 million visitors come to experience Idaho's unspoiled beauty, including 3,500 miles of rivers — more than any other state in the Lower 48. Nearly two-thirds of Idaho is public land, offering vast spaces to explore and experience quiet solitude — even in one of the fastest-growing states in the union.

Key industries include agriculture, food processing, technology, mining, and tourism. As of 2024, the state had a population of just over 2 million people.

Appointed by the Idaho State Board of Education, Dr. David W. Hahn became Boise State University's eighth president on July 1, 2026. Prior to joining Boise State, he served as the Craig M. Berge Dean of the College of Engineering at the University of Arizona, where he led one of the nation's premier engineering colleges and helped advance research, innovation, and industry partnerships.

With more than two decades of leadership experience in higher education, research, and innovation, Dr. Hahn has been recognized for fostering interdisciplinary collaboration, expanding research opportunities, strengthening connections between universities and industry, and supporting student success.

Dr. Hahn earned his B.S. and Ph.D. from Louisiana State University and holds 12 U.S. patents. His experience in engineering, research, and industry engagement positions him to lead Boise State as it advances its research ambitions, expands its impact, and enters a new era of national prominence as a member of the Pac-12 Conference.
