Executive Summary

In response to the ever-growing need for a well-trained workforce in healthcare, mental health, and behavioral and psychological sciences, the University of Massachusetts Global is establishing a **School of Health and Behavioral Sciences** and seeks an exceptional academic leader to serve as its **Founding Dean**.

UMass Global is committed to providing adult learners the knowledge, skills, and practical strategies to improve client and patient care. Under the leadership of the Founding Dean, the School of Health and Behavioral Sciences will build on existing offerings in behavioral health and wellness, expanding strategically into areas of study such as public health, health care management, health education and promotion, health informatics, nutrition, and/or occupational therapy.

The School of Health and Behavioral Sciences will serve as the new academic home of UMass Global's departments of Psychology and Social Work and their respective programs, including a MA in Professional Clinical Counseling (PCC) and the University's signature MA in Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT) and Master of Social Work (MSW).

UMass Global recently discontinued its nursing programs due to regulatory changes made by the California Board of Registered Nursing and does not plan to reinstate them in the foreseeable future.

The Founding Dean will develop a compelling vision and strategy for the School's future and lead efforts to implement these plans. To effectively lead the School of Health and Behavioral Sciences, the successful dean candidate will be an innovative and entrepreneurial leader and an effective relationship builder with deep experience in adult education and online learning and a steadfast commitment to excellence in teaching and learning.

UMass Global is a private, non-profit affiliate of the University of Massachusetts. Founded in 1958 and accredited by the WASC Senior College and University Commission, the university is committed to helping adult learners change their lives through education. UMass Global currently offers more than 55 online programs across the schools of Arts & Sciences, Business & Professional Studies, Education, and Extended Education. Role and Responsibilities of the Founding Dean

Curriculum Oversight

- Provide curricular leadership by initiating, sustaining, delivering, or eliminating academic programs and core curricula aligned with strategic goals.
- Develop new curricula, review existing curricula, review and approve catalog copy related to School programs and courses, and select appropriate delivery models in collaboration with faculty.
- Supervise program and accreditation reviews, ensure compliance with regulatory and accreditation standards, and maintain academic excellence through continual assessment of academic units, programs, and courses.
- Conduct annual reviews of the School's program and course portfolios, including comparative analyses of peer programs and facilitation of the removal of obsolete courses.
- Collaborate with university units to address program needs, and assess the availability of electronic library resources.

Faculty and Staff Oversight

- Develop and implement staffing plans, recruit new faculty, appoint search committees for new faculty hires, manage retirements and non-renewals, and oversee faculty evaluations, reappointments, and promotions.
- Ensure adequate faculty support for School programs and approve faculty workload plans.
- Collaborate with faculty, associate deans, and faculty directors to plan, supervise, and coordinate faculty and staff development.
- Conduct regular school-wide meetings and supervise associate deans, faculty directors, and support staff.

Academic Administration

- Lead efforts to achieve institutional goals within the School of Health and Behavioral Studies.
- Maintain open communication with and disseminate relevant information among faculty, staff, and administration.
- Oversee class scheduling, course reviews, and program document updates to ensure efficiency and alignment with program pathways.
- Promote and implement the effective use of technology to enhance teaching and learning, and administrative efficiency.
- Utilize data analytics to inform strategic decision-making and improve program outcomes.
- Represent the School at relevant professional associations, regulatory bodies, and accrediting agencies.

Outreach

- Forge and maintain domestic and international partnerships with corporate and non-corporate entities to promote the School's programs.
- Develop and deliver micro-credentials to meet the specific needs of industry partners.
- Collaborate with internal stakeholders to align outreach efforts with the School's strategic goals.

Fiscal Management

- Manage the School's fiscal affairs, including the approval and disbursement of funds for faculty and staff travel and professional development.
- Allocate resources strategically to support academic programs and academic student services.

Opportunities and Expectations for Leadership

The Founding Dean serves as the school's chief academic leader and promotes a culture of continuous improvement and innovation. Reporting to the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs, the Dean is an ambassador of the school to the rest of the institution as well as to external audiences and bodies at the local, state, and national levels.

The Founding Dean of the School of Health and Behavioral Sciences will be expected to:

- Provide strategic, inspirational leadership.
 - Articulate and advance a compelling, unifying vision for the School's future driven by innovation and a commitment to excellence in teaching and learning.
- Inspire programmatic innovation and excellence in teaching and learning.
 - Drive the development of new programs and curricula that respond to current workforce demands and anticipate future needs and trends. Catalyze pedagogical innovation and inspire the use of new technology to enhance teaching and learning.
- Cultivate and steward strategic external partnerships.
 - Develop and maintain relationships with industry, government, not-for-profit, and other organizations, domestically and globally to create mutually beneficial programs and to identify opportunities for new academic credentials.
- Develop and implement a strategic enrollment management strategy.
 - Work with school leaders, program directors, and faculty to enable reliable enrollment modeling and ensure both short-term and long-term growth.
- Identify opportunities for internal collaboration across UMass Global.
 - Partner with the School of Extended Education and other UMass Global units on educational offerings and credentials to address market demands.

History

UMass Global's origins reach back to 1958 when Chapman College professors first delivered on-base classes to members of the military serving at Marine Corps Air Station El Toro in Orange County, California.

In the decades that followed, service members and civilian students alike benefited from the availability of classes provided at several additional locations in California and beyond. These facilities were reorganized as Chapman University College in 2001, which led to the college's incorporation as a new university in 2008.

The following year, the university took on a new name: Brandman University. A regionally-accredited university, Brandman upheld its predecessors' legacy of service to active-duty and veteran students while simultaneously expanding its programs by investing in hybrid, online, and competency-based learning modalities meeting the needs of busy adult students.

In 2021, through a strategic partnership with the University of Massachusetts, the university became UMass Global and transitioned to 100% online learning. Responding to learner preferences and demand, the shift afforded students greater flexibility and eliminated time spent commuting to campus.

Innovative, Flexible Online Learning

UMass Global offers several degree programs through MyPath, the University's competency-based education (CBE) program. MyPath courses are completely self-paced. Students can work through coursework on their own schedule without set deadlines. For many adult learners, this online learning is the perfect solution to changing work schedules. MyPath courses have a set fee per CBE academic year with no limit to the number of courses in which a student can enroll within a 24-week billing period. In addition, tuition includes all books and materials, which are provided electronically.

Student-Centered Support

UMass Global understands that connecting virtually requires a different approach to service. The online support team promotes a Student-Centered Care Model in all student interactions and continually refines its services to better suit students' needs. UMass Global is committed to providing seamless support services that enable students to focus on their programs and achieve academic success.

Support begins before students even enroll. Each potential student is paired with an enrollment coach who provides guidance and personalized support through the admissions process. Enrollment coaches detail programs that match learner interests and goals and explain timelines. They remain in touch with those who pursue enrollment, checking in before courses begin to ensure a successful start. These one-stop specialists also help admitted students with financial questions, including on topics such as tuition, financial aid, scholarships and grants, fees, the FAFSA application, and ordering textbooks.

Once admitted, each student is paired with an academic advisor who will remain with them throughout their program, helping them to stay on course to graduation. At the outset, they work together to develop a personalized education plan based on the student's career goals and other considerations. Along the way, UMass Global's Career Development Center provides a comprehensive suite of resources to assist Global students in managing and reaching their career goals.

The School of Health and Behavioral Sciences will be the new academic home of the longstanding departments of Psychology and Social Work and their respective programs.

Psychology

The Department of Psychology currently offers an online BA in Psychology, minor in Psychology, MA in Marriage and Family Therapy, and MA in Professional Clinical Counseling.

The MA in Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT) is the latest iteration of a program that has been continuously offered for more than 50 years. The program has long produced marriage and family therapists in California and Washington. Today, the MFT program enrolls students from, and prepares graduates for licensure in, nearly all 50 states. The program is currently in the COAMFTE accreditation process.

Since its launch in 2013, the MA in Professional Clinical Counseling (PCC) has grown from a campus-based program in California to an online program that now prepares graduates across the country for state licensure or its equivalent.

Most courses in the MFT and PCC programs include one weekly synchronous virtual class meeting while other coursework is 100% asynchronous. In both programs, students collaborate with full-time clinical faculty to identify a practicum placement site in or near their place of residence. In most states, students have the option to enroll in the MA in Marriage and Family Therapy program's dual emphasis. With this option, graduates are eligible for both MFT and PCC licensure.

Social Work

The Department of Social Work offers an online BA in Social Work, minor in Social Work, Master of Social Work (MSW), Doctor of Social Work (DSW), and, for California residents, a School Social Work Credential.

The BA and MSW programs are CSWE-accredited and enroll students from most states. All program courses are asynchronous. Students collaborate with full-time field faculty and staff to identify a practicum placement site in or near their place of residence. Graduates of the BA program are eligible for baccalaureate-level social work licensure in states that have a baccalaureate-level social work license, and MSW graduates are eligible for masters-level social work licensure.

The MSW program has an Advanced Generalist focus and offers an Advanced Standing option for students who recently earned a bachelor's degree in social work. Students in the MSW program also have the option to enroll in the California Pupil Personnel Services Credential in School Social Work. The program was established in 2023 to address the critical shortage of school social workers in California public schools. MSW graduates who complete this add-on program are eligible for employment as social workers in California schools.

A new online Doctor of Social Work degree will launch by Fall 2026. Comprising three core curricular areas and completely asynchronous courses, the DSW program is designed to prepare and produce innovative leaders in telehealth clinical practices, social and global entrepreneurship, and online higher education. Approved by WSCUC, the program will commence the CSWE accreditation process once it launches.

Leadership

David Andrews Chancellor

David W. Andrews, PhD, is a lifelong educator committed to equity and access through personalized student centric approaches. He is currently Chancellor of University of Massachusetts Global (UMass Global). He also serves as Chair of the President's Forum and Chair of the National Laboratory for Educational Transformation.



Prior to joining UMass Global, Dr. Andrews served as President of National University, the second largest private non-profit university in California. As Dean of the School of Education at Johns Hopkins University, Dr. Andrews established a reputation for quality that earned a *U.S. News & World Report* No. 1 ranking among Graduate Schools of Education two years in a row. He also led the design, build, and start of the first new public school (PK-8th Grade) in East Baltimore in over 25 years.

Prior to his work at Johns Hopkins, Dr. Andrews led a merger that resulted in the creation of the College of Education and Human Ecology at The Ohio State University and was the new college's founding dean. His scholarly work has focused on intervening in the life course of high risk and difficult to serve students. Dr. Andrews holds a BA in psychology from Auburn University, a MS in child development from Kansas State University, and a PhD in child development from Florida State University.

Jeremy Korr Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs

Jeremy Korr, PhD, is Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs at the University of Massachusetts Global. His prior appointments include Dean and Associate Dean of Arts & Sciences at UMass Global; Associate Director of the College Park Scholars Program in American Cultures at the University of Maryland, College Park; and Visiting Assistant Professor of History in the Student Recommended Faculty Program at the University of California, Irvine.



During his 12-year term as Dean, the School of Arts & Sciences launched and received professional accreditation for its BA Social Work and Master of Social Work programs; developed and received California Commission on Teacher Credentialing approval for the Pupil Personnel Services Credential in School Social Work; and, with the School of Business and Professional Studies, co-developed and launched the university's undergraduate competency-based MyPath programs.

Dr. Korr serves as UMass Global's lead representative to the Association of American Colleges and Universities. He is a member of the Association of Chief Academic Officers, American Conference of Academic Deans, and Organization of American Historians. He has published, taught, and presented in the areas of urban and transportation history, food and culture, cultural geography, American Studies, and higher education. In addition, has led contra dance and folk dance programs for communities and schools since 1992. Dr. Korr received a BA in English and a MA and PhD in American Studies from the University of Maryland, College Park.
